Thank you for taking the time to contact the U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP), Compliments and Complaints Branch regarding Asylee status.

Pursuant to 8 CFR § 235.5 CBP conducts a “pre-inspection” process in Guam prior to allowing passengers to board the flight to Honolulu. This pre-inspection is conducted in order to determine admissibility and/or removability.

Pursuant to INA § 212(d)(5)(A) citizens of Russian in Guam who were initially paroled into the US under the DHS Secretary’s Russian parole program, who then applied for asylum and who’s asylum application is still pending, are considered to be applicants for admission who have not been granted any legal status. 8 CFR § 235.5 prohibits any person who has not been found to be admissible, from departing from Guam on the flight to Honolulu. Upon pre-inspection these paroled Russians on Guam are not found to be admissible and are thus denied boarding. Persons who have been granted asylum status would generally not be prevented from boarding the flight.
